## Exchange Program E-Paper 2

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During my first month in Paris, I need to adapt with a lot of things. The semester started on the beginning of January. There are a lot of refugees and immigrants almost everywhere. There are many pickpockets. The people also were not as friendly as people in Taiwan who will willingly help others even when they do not know each other.

After a few weeks there, I start to be able to adapt well. I realized that it is unfair to judge a city just because it was different from the places I used to live before. I started to learn that Paris today is created and affected by many things like: history, culture, politic, geographical position, weather, and so on. I tried to understand and explore deeper about all of that.

Some places I visitted: Eiffel Tower at Night, Sacre cœur, Museé d'Orsay.

- **Eiffel tower** is a must visit monument when you visit Paris. It was build by an engineer named Gustave Eiffel. It has 3 levels. There are restaurants in the first and second floor and on the third floor is the observation deck. The picture was taking at the night when I was taking a boat trip around Seine river together with the other exchange students.
