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## **REPORT 1 – ARRIVAL TO SINGAPORE**

I arrived to Singapore on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> of November, my flight landed at 2.30 a.m., that moment I was really tired but still amazed by the beauty of the Singapore Airport, and by the views of the city while I was sitting in the taxi going to my new apartment.
