<u>For Students:</u> Students from partner universities are nominated by their home institutions. Nominated students will be contacted by WBS staff via email and requested to submit the documents below to complete admission including visa application procedures.

- 1. Application Form for Exchange Program / for Certificate of Eligibility (COE)
- 2. Academic Objectives and Research/Study Plan
- 3. Latest Transcript or Certificate of Academic Records from one's home institution
- 4. Statement of Financial Resources
- 5. Certification of financial resources sufficient to cover living expenses while staying in Japan
- 6. A scanned copy of applicant's passport (photo page)
- 7. Digital file of passport-sized photograph that will be used for student ID card and residence card (headshots with no backgrounds; 3 x 4)

VISA Procedure A Certificate of Eligibility (COE) is a necessary document for visa issuance. We will apply for the COE based on the information the student provide in the application form. As soon as the COE is issued, an electronic version of the COE and Letter of Acceptance will be emailed to the student. Upon receipt, students are required to apply for a student visa at the nearest Japanese Embassy or Consulate.

Courses Available for Exchange Students		
[Credits and Workload of Courses]		
Our class structure is 100 minutes per class with a 14-week workload of		
approximately 23.3 hours, equivalent to 2 credits. This means that a course which is		

allocated 2 credits has a workload requirement of 14 weeks full-time work including lectures, classes, contact hours, assignments, examinations, and independent study. The WBS does not have regulation about minimum (course) credit requirement, but exchange students can take up to 10 courses. The designated course list for exchange students will typically be shared one month before the commencement of each semester, and course registration will take place online during Orientation Week.

<u>MBA program</u>: Elective and bilingual courses offered at MBA program are open to exchange students. Core courses, IMBA Elective Core courses and overseas courses are not open to exchange students.

<u>MSc in Finance program</u>: Compulsory Elective core subjects are open to exchange students.

#### **Other Courses**

[Japanese language course offered by Center for Japanese Language(CJL)] Japanese language courses are available to all exchange students. Should the number of applicants exceed class capacity, a lottery system will be implemented in which students are randomly selected for course enrolment. Please be noted that we cannot guarantee if you will be selected to take the courses you registered for. As of AY2023, exchange students are not charged for the course registration. However, please be advised that it is subject to change.
