# Academic information



## Degree structures

Aalto University adopted the Bologna-based degree structure in 2005. The B.Sc. is a three-year programme, while the M.Sc. is expected to be completed in two years. The Doctoral degree is a four-year programme.

Bachelor's Degree Structure: (180 cr)

- Fundamentals of Business Knowledge, 71 cr
- Courses in International Business Major, 52 cr
- Minor Studies (completed abroad), 30 cr
- Language and communication studies, 15 cr
- Elective studies, 12 cr

## Courses

At the Mikkeli Campus the academic year is divided into 15 three-week modules and courses are offered throughout the year, also during the summer. The students study one course at the time in each 3-week module. For a typical module, classes for a 6 ECTS course are scheduled for three hours a day, five days a week, for a total of 45 contact hours, which includes examinations. Due to the intensive modular structure, attendance is mandatory and only few absences are allowed per course.

Each 6 ECTS course satisfies the ECTS student workload requirement of 160 average student working hours. The entire course related work (including exams) will be completed within the three-week module. There are no separate exam periods.

## Summer studies

Summer studies in Mikkeli offer unique experiences for exchange students with international atmosphere and beautiful endless summer days in lake area of Finland. During the summer, students can choose to come to study for 3–13 weeks (1–4 courses) and get 6–24 ECTS credits (no tuition fee).

# Application and admission

## Application information and requirements

Students interested in an exchange at the School of Business should first contact the study abroad coordinator at their home universities. The School of Business accepts exchange students nominated by its partner universities only. After being nominated by the home university, the students will receive a link to the online application.

The documents to be uploaded with the online application are:

- Official transcript of records
- Curriculum vitae
- Certificate of English Proficiency or copy of the language test report
- Photo

Once the application is completed and approved, the students will receive the official letter of acceptance by e-mail.

Please note: Aalto University School of Business Mikkeli Campus exchange students are not able to take courses at the Otaniemi Campus and vice versa.

## Language requirements

Although no official test records of English like TOEFL or IELTS are required, we expect nominated students to be proficient in English both in writing and in communicating in the classroom in order to complete the course assignments.

The home institution verifies students' proficiency prior to nominating them to Aalto. The expected level of English proficiency is equivalent to IELTS 6.5 (total), TOEFL 87 (total) or CEFR B2.

## Visa or residence permit requirements

Depending on the nationality and the length of stay, the student may need a visa or a residence permit. Students should immediately proceed with the visa/residence permit application after receiving the letter of acceptance as the process may take up to six weeks.

The application can be sent via the e-service of the Finnish Immigration Service ([EnterFinland](#)) and after that the student needs to visit the Finnish Embassy or consulate in their home country. Travel arrangements should only be made once the visa or residence permit has been issued.

Students from an EU country or Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland may reside in Finland for a maximum of three months without registering their right of residence ([EnterFinland](#)).

Students from the other Nordic countries do not need a visa or a residence permit to live or work in Finland. Nordic citizens must register their stay if residing in Finland for more than six months.

## Orientation and tutoring

Orientation days are organized at the beginning of each semester. The tutoring service is organized in close cooperation with the Student Organization Probba. Each exchange student is paired up with a local student, who will act as a personal tutor. The tutor will contact the exchange student before their arrival. The tutor will meet the exchange student when they arrive in Mikkeli and helps them to settle in at the beginning of the semester and with various issues throughout the exchange period.

## Services on campus

The building provides adequate space for a wide range of academic activities and student uses. On the campus there are



also a library, a cafeteria, administrative support offices and student study rooms. IT services are provided in cooperation with Aalto IT, and the Mikkeli Campus is a part of the Aalto University network offering the same services as other campuses.

## Benefits for students

Exchange students are entitled to discounts in transportation and student-priced meals in student cafeterias. Students may join the Aalto University Student Union (AYY). The student union organizes many leisure time activities such as parties, field trips, sports and cultural activities.

Probba is the official student organization of the School of Business BScBA Programme at the Mikkeli Campus. The main responsibilities of the organization include promoting the general well-being of students, organizing events, being a link between the staff and the students and arranging orientation and tutors for incoming exchange students.

# About living in Mikkeli and Finland

## Housing and living costs

Accommodation is arranged by the local student housing company, Mikalo Oy. Students apply for the accommodation through Mikalo: <https://mikalo.fi/en>.

Normally students stay in shared apartments near the campus. In shared apartments, students will have their own lockable bedroom and share the kitchen and bathroom with 1–2 students. There are also single apartments available. The rent varies from 335 euros for a shared apartment and approximately 480 euros for a single apartment (the rent includes furniture, electricity, water, Internet, use of laundry and sauna). A monthly budget for exchange students would be approximately 700–900 euros per month (including accommodation, living expenses, course materials and personal expenses).



## Health insurance

Citizens of non EU/EEA countries who are studying longer than three months in Finland are required to have a valid health insurance when applying for residence permit. Students from EU/EEA countries are entitled to medical care while staying temporarily in another EU/EEA country with European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Private insurance is however strongly recommended as an additional security.

Finland is situated in northern Europe bordering Sweden, Norway and Russia. It is a republic and a member of the European Union since 1995. Finland has approximately 5.5 million inhabitants. The national languages are Finnish (89%) and Swedish (5.3%), but most Finns speak also fluent English. The Euro is used as currency. Finland has one of the most advanced education systems in the world and has both a high standard of living and quality of life. The Finnish population is highly educated by international comparison, and education is valued in the society. For seven years straight, starting in 2018, the World Happiness Report has singled out Finland as the happiest country on the planet.
