

2025 Fall [Amundi International Overseas Study Scholarship] Application Announcement

To encourage students to study abroad and enhance their international competitiveness through academic and multicultural exchanges, the NCCU College of Commerce established the Amundi International Exchange Study Scholarship in 2021 with support from the Amundi Asset Management Innovation Research Center. Interested students must complete the online registration between April 1 and April 30 (by 12:00 PM) and submit the required hardcopy documents by April 30 (5:00 PM) to Room 607, Yi-Xian Building.

I. [Funding Recipients]

1. Overseas Study Scholarship

Applicable to undergraduate and master's students from the College of Commerce participating in the 2025 Fall Exchange Program or short-term study programs recommended by the College.

Note: Double majors, minor program students, and in-service program students are not eligible. However, students in dual degree programs are eligible to apply.

2. Short-Term Overseas Study Courses

Applicable to undergraduate and master's students from the College of Commerce participating in short-term study programs.

Note: Double majors, minor program students, and in-service program students are not eligible. Dual degree students are eligible.

II. [Eligibility Requirements]

For the Overseas Study Scholarship:

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

Academic Performance:

Undergraduate students: Must be ranked in the top 30% of their department/class.

Master's students: Must have an overall semester average of at least 85 points.

Language Proficiency:

Applicants must meet the language proficiency standards outlined in the College's "Overseas Study Program Subsidy Guidelines". If the host institution's language of instruction is not English, the requirements of the host institution will apply.

Outstanding Achievements:

Applicants must demonstrate outstanding achievements in at least one of the following areas:

Excellence in academic studies or research.

Active participation and contributions to public affairs at the university/college/department level.

Exceptional performance in national or international competitions.

Leadership roles as core members of student organizations or class representatives.

Dedication to community service or volunteer work with notable accomplishments.

Other remarkable achievements that can serve as examples to others.

III. [Required Documents for Application]

All documents must be scanned into a single PDF file and uploaded to the application system.

Please double-check the order and completeness of your files before uploading.

Supporting Documents:

Resume and Personal Statement (up to 2 A4 pages).

Official Academic Transcript in Chinese.

Class Ranking Certificate (for undergraduate students only; not required for master's students).

Valid Language Proficiency Certificate (within two years).

Study Plan (up to 2 A4 pages).

Proof of Outstanding Achievements.

Other Supporting Documents (e.g., proof of financial hardship).

Personal Data Collection Consent Form.

Dual Degree Admission Letter or Internal Admission List (for dual degree applicants only).

Note: For short-term study courses, the program must last at least 7 days.

IV. [Overseas Study Scholarship Application Process]

1. [Online Registration](#):

Available from April 1 to April 30 (by 12:00 PM).

2. Print the Application Form:

After completing the online registration, applicants will receive a system notification to print the application form. The form must be signed by the department head and submitted by April 30 (5:00 PM) to the Office of International Affairs (Room 607, Yi-Xian Building).

3. Hardcopy Submission of Required Documents:

Applicants must submit the following documents to the Office of International Affairs (Room 607, Yi-Xian Building) by April 30 (5:00 PM):

Application Form: Must include a photo, address, signature, and a checklist of the required documents. The form must be signed by the department head.

Official Academic Transcript in Chinese.

Class Ranking Certificate (for undergraduate students only; not required for master's students).

Two Letters of Recommendation from Professors (only for dual degree applicants).

Submission Deadline: April 30 (5:00 PM) at Room 607, Yi-Xian Building.

Contact Person: Jane (Office of International Affairs).

Note: Late or incomplete submissions will not be accepted.

Reminders:

Applicants must complete the online registration and upload all required documents as a single PDF file in the specified order.

Supporting documents for outstanding achievements must match the details provided in the application form and must include valid proof of participation, with clear annotations of dates, event names, and roles.

V. [Short-Term Overseas Study Course Application Process]

Applications for short-term study courses must be submitted in **hardcopy only**.

Required documents include:

Research Proposal (up to 2 A4 pages).

Admission Letter or Invitation Letter from the overseas institution.

One Letter of Recommendation from a Professor.
