ECTS requirement per semester: 15 to 30 ects

Language Requirement: For the programmes taught in English, we strongly recommend that non-native English speakers or students not taking their home university degree in English provide a *TOEFL* score of 550 or equivalent or have an English professor complete the English language certificate, attesting to a minimum of B2 according to the Common European Framework.

For the programmes taught in French, we strongly recommend a B2 French level.


Founded in 1909 in Angers, France, ESSCA is a Business School that offers a wide range of management programmes and degrees accessible immediately after the French baccalaureate.


