NOMINATION

Students must be nominated by their home institution within the indicated nomination windows, and must satisfy the following requirements:

- Enrolled in a Graduate programme at Home Institution;
- 180 ECTS obtained before the exchange;
- Minimum B2-High English level - students must have one of the following:
 - English Proficiency statement from Home Institution indicating current English level
 - IELTS 7.0 or TOEFL 100 obtained in the last 2 years

Students with a minimum B2 level in Italian may participate in the Exchange Programme within one of our Italian-taught programmes. Applicants will be required to complete a short interview to verify their Italian language proficiency. For the list of available programmes, please contact the Internationalization Office.

APPLICATION & PROGRAMME SELECTION

Students will receive the Application Form before the Student Application window opens. They must upload the following documents: CV in English, most recent transcript, proof of English proficiency, copy of a valid passport, and an photo for their student card.

Students must select three preferred Master's programmes from Luiss Business School's offerings (see page 3). **All programmes have limited capacity and are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis**, according to the order of applications and students' stated preferences. If none of the selected preferences are available, students will be offered a place in another programme with remaining capacity.

Useful Information



Students can participate in the exchange programme for either a single term or the entire semester. During their exchange period, students are required to complete a minimum of 4 courses.

Specialized Masters: 1 ECTS equals 7 class hours or 25 hours of total workload (class hours + individual study)

MBA: 1 ECTS equals 6 class hours or 25 hours of total workload (class hours + individual study)

ECTS available in each semester/term may vary according to each programme's calendar. We recommend the Partner contact us if the incoming student needs more than 20 ECTS during their exchange.

Incoming students can choose courses **only** from the Master Programme assigned to them. Exceptions might be considered case by case.


GRADING SYSTEM

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

VISA & TAX CODE

For more information about obtaining a Visa, please see the government [website](#). Once students complete the application form, they will be contacted to receive a Visa Letter from our Visa Office in order to start the Visa process, if necessary.

Permit of stay: non-EU students are required to apply for the Permit of Stay within 8 business days from their arrival in Italy **only** if they have a Visa longer than 90 days. Students will need to communicate their arrival date to the Visa Office who will provide them with the “Yellow Kit” to fill out and send from the Post Office in order to receive an appointment at the Immigration Office.

Tax Code (Codice Fiscale): Students will need an Italian Tax Code (Codice Fiscale) for several administrative procedures during their stay in Italy. Before travelling, students are advised to check whether their local Italian Consulate can issue the Tax Code prior to their arrival. If this is not possible, students staying in Italy for less than 90 days may apply for a Tax Code after arrival at any office of the Italian Revenue Agency (Agenzia delle Entrate). Students who will stay for more than 90 days must first apply for a permit of stay (Permesso di Soggiorno) at the Italian State Police (Questura), and the Tax Code will normally be issued during this procedure.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Non-EU students must have health insurance with international validity in order to be issued the study visa and the permit of stay.

EU students are required to have the European Health Insurance Card or a similar private insurance policy with international validity to benefit from health services in Italy.

ACCOMMODATION
