ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

MITB's partner university will forward a list of the exchange students that have been nominated to the MITB office, SMU, by the above-agreed deadlines.

Documents that need to be submitted together with the nomination will be:

- Resume/CV
- University transcripts
- Identification documents

Only shortlisted candidates will be admitted to the exchange programme.

STUDENT'S PASS AND IMMIGRATION

All international students are required to hold a valid Student's Pass during their term of studies in Singapore. The Student's Pass enables the student to live and study in Singapore, as well as serves as a multiple-entry visa into Singapore (subject to terms & conditions).

Enrolment into the SMU MITB Exchange Programme is conditional on students obtaining the necessary student visa from the Singapore Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA). SMU MITB office will assist at its best effort and in good faith in the issuance of appropriate documentation for purposes of obtaining the student visa one month before enrolment into SMU.

Nevertheless, students shall bear the responsibility to complete and fulfill the application requirements for the Student's Pass before their arrival in Singapore. More information on the Student's Pass application will be provided two months before the start of the academic term.

For information on immigration matters that may affect students' stay in Singapore, please visit Singapore ICA's website.

Important:

By regulation, Student's Pass holders (exchange & visiting students) are strictly not permitted to undertake any form of internship or work (regardless of paid or unpaid) during their term of studies in Singapore. Offenders are subjected to punishment in accordance with Singapore laws.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Class Format & Size: Interactive seminar-style comprising 35 - 45 students.

Course Load: Full course load per term: 4.0 SMU credits. Minimum course load per term: 2.0 SMU credits. Students may be permitted to enrol for a maximum course load of 4.0 SMU credits per term, subject to approval and agreement by the home university and SMU.

Credit Weightage: Each full-credit course is equivalent to 1.0 SMU credit, and consists of 30 contact hours per term. Each half-credit course is equivalent to 0.5 SMU credit, and consists of at least 15 contact hours per term.

Course Assessment: Assessments can include, but not limited to (i) class attendance; (ii) class participation; (iii) individual project; (iv) group project; (v) presentation (individual/group); (vi) mid-term test; (vii) final examination.

Class Attendance & Participation: Attendance and participation form part of the course assessment, hence attendance is mandatory for all classes. Absence from classes due to health/medical reasons must be validated by medical certification. Absence due to other reasons require prior approval by the course instructor.

TRANSCRIPT

A digital transcript will be emailed to the student's SMU campus email, within three months after the release of the final examination results, i.e. mid-March (Term 1) and mid-July (Term 2). The transcript will include the course title, course code and grade of the respective courses enrolled. No hardcopy of the transcript will be issued.

SMU does not send the digital transcript to any third party including the student's home university. Therefore, students are responsible for providing the transcript to their home university for credit transfer.

It is important for students to maintain their access to the SMU email account after they finish the programme. This is to ensure that they can retrieve the digital transcript before the email account expires. Charges are applicable if students need their digital transcript to be re-issued

ACCOMMODATION

The SMU campus is situated in the heart of the city with many private housing options that are within walking distance to SMU and conveniently accessible to amenities and transportation networks. Students have the flexibility and choice to source and arrange for their own accommodation based on their needs. Arrangements are at the sole responsibility and discretion of the student.

For rental of private apartments/condominiums, it is important that students read and understand Singapore's governing policies on rental/leasing of accommodation, from the Singapore Urban Redevelopment Authority (URA) <u>website</u>.

Students are also strongly advised to read and understand all terms and conditions of the leasing agreement before committing to the lease. Once the lease has been accepted and signed, the signatories have a legal obligation to fulfil all the terms stated in the agreement. Please note that Airbnb is strongly discouraged as residential properties in Singapore are not allowed to be used for short-term accommodation under the law.

SMU does not represent either party in any disputes arising from the rental/lease of the property.

EXPENSES

In accordance with the student exchange agreement with our partner universities, exchange students are not required to pay tuition fee to SMU. However, other administrative fees are applicable i.e. Student's Pass (Visa), Miscellaneous Fee etc.

Student's Pass (Student Visa) Fee

There will be a non-refundable processing fee of \$\$30 for each application, a \$\$60 issuance fee for the Student's Pass and a \$\$30 fee for a Multiple Journey Visa (if applicable). Approval is subject to terms and conditions.

Registration Fee

A one-time registration fee of \$\$240 per term is applicable.

- Pre-course activities, e.g. Orientation (IO)

Estimated Monthly Expenses
