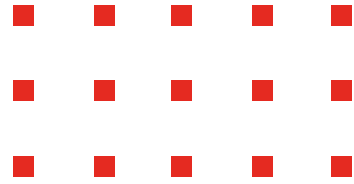

Classes & lectures : **BUSINESS in EUROPE**

All classes, lectures and visits will be held in English. Kindly note that students are required to take all classes on the syllabus.

Upon successful completion of the program, students will receive a transcript of records.

Course 1 Responsible Leadership for a Sustainable Europe	Course 2 Understanding Europe
This interactive course prepares the leaders of tomorrow to better tackle sustainable development challenges through the lens of intercultural competence and responsible leadership. By exploring relevant competency frameworks and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) students explore the essential skills, knowledge, and mindset to act as engaged global citizens and professionals. Students will participate in a powerful SDG game-based challenge simulating what could happen in our world in 2030 and beyond.	This course introduces the foundations of the European Union and traces its integration process, with a focus on economic, environmental, and current policy challenges. Through case studies, visits to EU institutions in Strasbourg, and a role-playing game at the European Parliament, students will explore how EU decisions impact the business world while developing negotiation skills and a deeper understanding of European dynamics.

Corporate visits & French culture introduction

Practical information

Level

Undergraduate (Students must have completed at least 1 year of higher education).

Prerequisites

Open to undergraduate students with a basic knowledge of business, international relations or economics.
Nominations for individuals from other disciplines will also be considered.

Language requirements

Proficiency in English (minimum level of B2 in English according to the Common European Reference Framework of Languages).



Admission process

Partner universities will receive a link in the Fall of 2025 and will have until **March 15th, 2026** to nominate their students.

Students from non-partner universities should contact us at **summer.school@em-strasbourg.eu**.

Acceptance

Qualified students will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. Upon acceptance, students will receive instruction on the next steps to finalize their application. Acceptance letters will be sent to students upon completion of their dossier.

Cancellation policy

Up until and including **May 4th, 2026**, student cancellations will be refunded minus a 300 euros administrative fee. **After May 4th, 2026**, no refund will be possible.

EM Strasbourg Business School reserves the right to cancel the Summer School if it does not reach the minimum number of participants. If this occurs, the full program fee will be returned to students.

Program Fees

€ 1,500 for students from partner universities
€ 2,000 for students from non-partner universities

The fee includes:

- Tuition for the 2 week course
- Corporate visits
- Participation in the French cultural program and visits
- Transportation to site visits
- Welcome and Farewell lunches

Accommodation & insurance

Accommodation

Students are accommodated in student residence halls near the school and are responsible for housing costs (around 250 - 350€ for two weeks).

Further information will be sent to applicants. Students are expected to arrive 1-2 days prior to the beginning of the program (reservations will be made accordingly).

Insurance

Students are required to have a health insurance during their stay in France.

European Students and Students from Quebec

If you come from one of the countries of the European Economic Area (EEA) AND if you pay for your national health insurance, your health protection in France will be ensured by your home country via the European Health Insurance Card which you need to arrange before coming to France. Students from Quebec benefit from an agreement between France and Quebec and have the same rights as the European students.

Non-European Students

Students coming from outside of the EEA need to have an international insurance that covers them in Europe.



VISA & immigration formalities

All students should check the expiration date of their passport before they leave their home country. It should be valid for at least 6 months after scheduled departure from Strasbourg.

Students from the EU

Students who hold the nationality of an EEA State (EU Member States + Switzerland, Norway and Liechtenstein) do not need a visa for France and do not need to go through any immigration procedures while in France.

Nevertheless, students need to bring a valid passport or an Identity Card.

Students from outside of the EU

Students coming from outside of the EEA area should find out themselves if they require a visa to come to France. If this is the case, students should contact the local French consulate. Students are responsible for their visa procedures.

EM Strasbourg Business School will provide the acceptance letter including housing details required for visa procedures.
