Undergraduate Summer School

This year the Undergraduate Summer School will run from 27 June to 5 August. We will be offering 21 credit-bearing modules from across nine schools of study.

Physics Undergraduate Summer School

The Physics Undergraduate Summer School will run from 27 June to 19 August.

It is an intensive 8-week programme, both theoretical and practical/labbased, and is designed to provide a firm foundation in physical concepts and principles of Physics.

Students will live on campus in our newest en-suite student accommodation, a few minutes' walk from classes.


