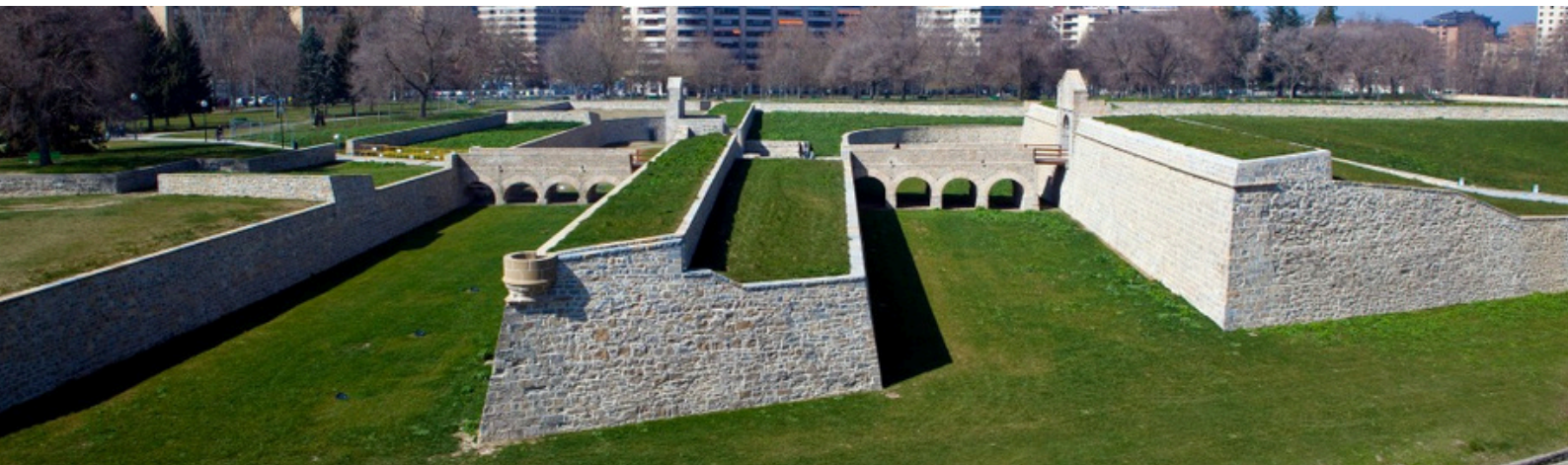

Information

Students must take between 24 and 30 ECTS, where a minimum of 18 ECTS must be from the School of Economics and Business. Therefore, 12 ECTS can be taken from other faculties/schools.

Courses value variate between 3 ECTS and 6 ECTS.

Our undergraduate programs are four years.

We offer low-level and upper-level courses for undergraduate exchange students.

Registration

Course registration is done online before arrival. It works on a first come, first served logic.

The Add & Drop period is during the first two weeks upon arrival.

Transcript of records

The transcripts of records will no longer be sent directly to the home university coordinator by our exchange office. Instead, the students will now be responsible for requesting their transcript to be sent via the MIUNAV online portal to them and to their home university coordinators.

Institution's language

The primary language of the University of Navarra is Spanish. However, as we offer bilingual programs to our students, there is a wide range of courses taught in English: around 50 courses per academic year.

Language requirements

Students must provide proof of their language level. An official test score or a letter from the home university verifying the level is accepted. The certificate needs to be provided for the language the courses will be taken (if only one language, only its corresponding certificate, and for both languages, both certificates).

- For English classes - B2 level
- For Spanish courses- B2 level

Spanish classes

The School offers Spanish language courses free of charge for non-Spanish-speaking students that can be taken throughout the semester in parallel with courses.

RELEVANT INFORMATION

Required documents for application

1. Nomination letter from home university
2. Proof of health insurance (or European Health Insurance card)
3. Proof of at least a B2 level of English or Spanish
4. Valid passport or European ID card
5. Headshot photo
6. Transcript of records

Housing

Students can rent apartments off campus and choose different accommodations depending on their needs. On-campus housing is not available for exchange students.
