Nomination Deadlines

Partner universities must send their nomination email to the International Affairs Office by the following deadlines:

- July edition: April 1, 2026

- **January edition:** December 15, 2025
- **July edition:** June 15, 2026

- International Health Insurance - must be valid before the arrival and throughout the program
- Passport-size photo - white background, no glasses
- Passport copy

Nomination & Application Information

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Language of Instruction

All courses are taught in **English**.

Language requirements: Non-native English speakers must provide proof of proficiency (TOEFL 80 or equivalent, or a university-issued certificate).

Prerequisites

To be eligible, students must meet the following requirements:

- **Academic** → Strong academic record and be in the second half of their MBA at the time of the exchange semester.
- **Work Experience** → At least two years of corporate work experience.

Workload

Students can enrol in **one or two** courses during the International Week. Each course consist of 18 contact hours.

Each course is worth **1.5 credits**. We use the North-American credit system.

Courses are scheduled in two different shifts: morning and afternoon.

Academic calendar

A few weeks before the International Week, students will select their courses in coordination with the Graduate Student Exchange Office.

Grading system

ESAN follows a continuous evaluation system, which includes class participation, quizzes, reports, among others defined by each professor in the course syllabus.

Exchange students are expected to maintain ethical and responsible conduct, in line with ESAN's General Regulations.

Exchange students can check their course grades on ESAN's virtual platform.

At the end of the International Week, ESAN will send the home institution the final transcripts for both the international coordinator and the student.

ESAN's grading scale ranges from 01 to 20, with 12 as the minimum passing grade.

Currency

The official currency in Peru is the Sol (S/.). While some establishments accept US dollars, it is not common. It is recommended to exchange money at official exchange houses.

Approximate Exchange Rate:

- 1€ ≈ S/. 3.99
- US\$ 1 ≈ S/. 3.35

Credit cards like Visa, MasterCard, and American Express are widely accepted in Lima.

Academic expenses

For students attending ESAN under an exchange agreement, academic costs are covered by the institutions. Tuition, course materials, and registration fees are waived.

Living expenses

To help students plan their stay, here's an estimated budget for one week in Lima:

Housing

ESAN does not provide on-campus housing but offers a list of pre-selected accommodation options. Students must contact them directly to arrange their stay.

The cost of living in Lima will depend on the lifestyle and accommodation choice. Short-term rentals range from US\$200 to US\$350 per week

Some students prefer to stay near the ESAN campus (Monterrico Chico), where they can find hotels and rentals on [Booking.com](#) or [Airbnb](#).

Others choose to stay in Miraflores, a vibrant district by the Pacific Ocean, with a rich cultural and social scene. Although it is about a 40-minute drive from campus, it offers a dynamic experience.

Food & Dining

Lima is a global culinary hotspot, known for its award-winning restaurants and rich flavours influenced by Indigenous, Spanish, African, and Asian traditions. Whether opting for casual eateries or fine dining, the city offers a world-class gastronomic experience.

- **Casual dining:** US\$10–US\$20 per meal
- **Mid-range restaurants:** US\$25+ per meal
- **Fine dining:** US\$70+ per meal - See the full list by [50 Best Discovery](#).

Transportation

For a more comfortable and safer option, there are ride-hailing apps like Uber, Cabify, or Taxi Satelital, all available on Android and iOS.

Other Expenses

Students should budget an additional \$150–\$300 for entertainment, shopping, and miscellaneous expenses.

Health Insurance

Students are required to have comprehensive health insurance. Before classes begin, they must provide proof that their insurance covers health care costs for the duration of the exchange.

Visa Requirements

Since the International Week is a short-term program, a visa is generally not required. However, this depends on the student's nationality.

Students who do not require an official visa will enter Peru with a tourist visa valid for up to 90 days.

If a visa is required to enter Peru, ESAN will assist students with the initial procedures. Students are responsible for completing the process and obtaining their visa at a Peruvian Consulate or Embassy before arriving.
